


FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE—French screenwriter and author **Sarah Kaminsky** will appear at the Museum of Jewish Heritage, 36 Battery Place, New York City, on Tuesday, March 7th at 7pm in conversation with **Joe Berger**, who has written for *The New York Times* and other publications.

Kaminsky will discuss the legacy of her father and the writing of her best-selling book *Adolfo Kaminsky: A Forger's Life* (**DoppelHouse Press**). The book has been translated into seven languages and chronicles her father's work as a forger for the 6th Section of the French Resistance, which saved the lives of an estimated 14,000 Jews. After the war, Kaminsky continued his work as a forger for human rights causes through the world for another 25 years.

Critics have called the book riveting, thrilling, touching, worthy of the best spy novels, and one of the most captivating books of the year. Kaminsky himself has been called by Der Spiegel "one of the world's best forgers" and The Jerusalem Post crowned him "the robin hood of false papers." In October 2016, The New York Times produced a 16 minute documentary about Adolfo Kaminsky that was honored with an award by World Press Photo.
